



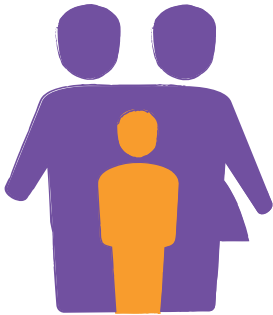
Fire door safety

Keeping you safe in your home

We are committed to putting the safety of our customers first. This leaflet provides you with information and advice about the fire doors fitted within your home.

Fire doors save lives

Fire doors are a critical element in fire safety and can delay the spread of fire and smoke, protecting your life and home.



Importance of fire doors:

- To save lives, fire doors must work correctly
- They must be fitted with the correct and compatible components suited to the door leaf and its purpose
- Like any fire safety device, they should be installed and maintained by competent people
- Never prop open a fire door.

As part of our fire risk assessment, it is important we carry out safety checks to all fire doors in your building, including flat entrance doors to your home.

How you can help?

It's important you give us access to your home so we can carry out the necessary safety checks to all fire doors. We'll write to you in advance and arrange a suitable date and time that is convenient to you.



We will undertake regular safety checks of communal doors in all blocks however, it is a legal requirement that annual checks are undertaken to all flat entrance doors in buildings over 11 metres.

What do we look for when we check fire doors?

Signage – checking all fire doors are signed properly, indicating their designation as a fire door

Hinges – making sure the hinges are in good condition

Seals – checking all the seals around the door are present and not damaged

Leaf – the leaf is the door itself, making sure it sits alongside the doorstep and is flush with the frame

Frame – checking the frame of the door is firmly attached to the wall, free from damage

Gaps – checking the gap under the door ensuring nothing is blocked to allow the door to open and close freely. Also checking for any gaps at the sides and head of the door

Closers – if fitted, check they are not damaged and are firmly attached to the door and wall and that the door closes under its own weight with the door closer

Glazing – check there is no damage or cracking to the glass if applicable.

To keep you and your neighbours safe, you can help us by:

- Granting us access to your home to carry out the necessary safety checks
- Checking your door closes and fits into the frame with gaps no larger than 4mm around the frame
- Ensuring the door closes of its own accord once released. Never remove the self-closing device fitted to the door
- Making sure there are no ornaments, posters etc attached to either side of your flat entrance door
- Contacting us immediately if your door gets damaged or needs to be repaired.

Remember these three simple fire door safety rules...

1. When you go to bed shut your doors
2. In the event of a fire, make sure all fire doors are closed
3. If you think anything is wrong with a fire door, please report it to us by calling **0808 164 0111**.
